6. Annexes to the Financial Statements

I. General Information

The European Monitoring Centre on Racism and Xenophobia (EUMC) is an independent body of the European Union established by Council Regulation (EC) No 1035/97 of 2 June 1997 (OJ L 151, 10 June 1997), which was amended by Council Regulation (EC) No 1652/2003 of 18 June 2003.

The EUMC is based in Vienna and its primary task is to provide the Community and its Member States with objective, reliable and comparable information and data on racism, xenophobia, Islamophobia and anti-Semitism at the European level in order to help the EU and its Member States to establish measures or formulate courses actions against racism and xenophobia.

On the basis of the data collected, the EUMC studies the extent and development of the phenomena and manifestations of racism and xenophobia, and analyses their causes, consequences and effects. It is also the task of the EUMC to work out strategies to combat racism and xenophobia and to highlight and disseminate examples of good practice regarding the integration of migrants and ethnic and religious minority groups in the EU Member States.

II. Legal Basis

The accounts are kept in accordance with the provisions of Title VII of the Financial Regulation of the EUMC as adopted by its Management Board on 20 November 2002. These accounting provisions are the same as Title VII of the Framework Financial Regulation for the bodies referred to in Article 185 of Council Regulation (EC, EURATOM) No. 1605/2002 on the Financial Regulation applicable to the general budget of the European Communities.

III. Accounting Rules and Principles

The EUMC's financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting rules adopted by the Commission's Accounting Officer on 28 December 2004, which in turn are based on the International Public Accounting Standards.

The financial statements have been drawn up in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles specified in Article 78 of the Financial Regulation of the EUMC, namely:

- going concern basis
- prudence
- consistent accounting methods
- · comparability of information
- materiality
- no netting
- reality over appearance
- accrual-based accounting

IV. Notes to the Financial Statements

a) Reporting Currency

The reporting currency is Euro (€). Some figures may be subject to rounding differences.

b) Change in Accounting Policies

The EUMC's 2005 financial statements are the first to be prepared under accruals accounting principles, in accordance with the accounting rules adopted by the Commission's Accounting Officer on 28 December 2004. In order to enhance comparability, the EUMC's 2004 financial statements, which were prepared under a modified cash accounting basis, have been restated following these accruals accounting principles.

c) Fixed Assets

In accordance with Accounting Rules 6 and 7 of the Commission, fixed assets are valued at their historic cost and are subject to depreciation on a straight line basis at the following rates:

V. Reconciliation between budgetary outturn and economic outturn

The EUMC's financial statements are prepared on an accruals basis, where transactions are recorded in the period to which they relate. The result for the year using this basis is indicated in the economic outturn account.

However, the EUMC uses a modified cash accounting system for preparing the budget outturn account and its other budgetary reporting. In this system only the payments made and revenues received in the period are recorded, together with payment appropriations that are carried forward.
