
Lack of awareness about LGBT issues among public officials & prejudices major barriers

VIEWS FROM LGBT PEOPLE

Almost half consider offensive language about LGBT people by politicians to be widespread

Half avoid public spaces like parks for fear of being assaulted, threatened or harassed
