

# INFORMATION NOTE



The Agency would like to inform the INFOCRIM online survey users that the following data are being stored to collect the experiences and views of member associations of the European Legal Interpreters and Translators Association (EULITA) of Directive 2010/64/EU.

- **INFOCRIM personal data**)

**Purpose:** The purpose of the collection of the processing of the personal data is to collect the experiences and views of EULITA member associations of Directive 2010/64/EU.

**Data Controller:** The Data Controller is the Head of Freedoms and Justice Department. This data is available on request to the Head of Freedoms and Justice Department and only for the purposes listed above.

**Legal Basis:** The Legal basis of the processing operation for which the data are intended is Article 5 a), b) and d) of Regulation 45/2001.

**Access to the Data:** Data can be accessed by relevant staff working on the INFOCRIM project.

Data subjects (i.e. INFOCRIM online survey users) are informed of the following rights inline with Articles 14, 15, 16, 17, 18 of Regulation 45/2001:

- **Right to access data** – The data subjects have the right to access personal data.
- **Right to block** – The data subjects can obtain from the Data Controller the blocking of data.
- **Right to rectify** – The data subjects can obtain from the Data Controller the rectification without delay of inaccurate or incomplete personal data.
- **Right to erase** – The data subjects can obtain from the Data Controller the erasure of the data. This right is applicable if the processing of data is unlawful.
- **Right to object** – The data subjects have the right to object to the processing of the data.

In order to exercise the rights listed above, a request should be sent to [access2justice@fra.europa.eu](mailto:access2justice@fra.europa.eu)

- **Right to obtain notification to third parties** – The data is not disclosed to third parties
- **Right to have recourse** at any time to the European Data Protection Supervisor (EDPS)

## Retention policy

1. **INFOCRIM personal data** is stored for a period of 24 months after the publication of the final project report on the FRA's website.
