Kirsten Roberts Lyer is an Associate Professor at Central European University's Department of Public Policy, specializing in international human rights law and policy. She teaches graduate-level courses on the Rule of Law and Human Rights. Kirsten is a recognized expert on National Human Rights Institutions (NHRI) whose publications on the topic include a book on NHRIs published by Oxford University Press. Her research focuses on protecting and strengthening independent state-level institutions for promoting and protecting human rights worldwide, with a particular focus on NHRIs, parliaments, and academic freedom (university autonomy). She has advised international organizations including the OSCE, International IDEA, and the EU Agency for Fundamental Rights on NHRIs and parliamentary engagement with human rights. Prior to joining CEU, Kirsten worked as a policy expert and international lawyer, and has held various roles, including as a Director at the Irish Human Rights Commission, Ireland's NHRI, and legal officer at the UN International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia. Kirsten holds a PhD in human rights from King's College London School of Law.
