The observations conclude on Denmark's latest effort on combatting racial discrimination in line with the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Racial Discrimination by its States parties	<p> Of particular relevance to hate speech and hate crime, CERD recommended that the State party: i) Removes barriers that prevent victims to report hate crime and hate speech, ii) ensures that all racially motivated crimes are prosecuted, iii) set up a comprehensive data-collection system, iv) continue the dialogue with the Danish National Police and the people most affected with hate crime and v) explicitly prohibits organizations and propaganda activities that promote and incite violence and racial discrimination </p>	The Committee delivered a broad range of recommendations to the State party from data collection, legal incorporation, enforcement, linguistic distinctions, the "parallel society" policy, hate crime and hate speech, racial profiling among other.	CERD submitted its concluding observations on the combined twenty-second to the twenty-fourth periodic reports by the Government of Denmark on the implementation of the international convention on the elimination on all forms of racial discrimination	"The Committee is concerned by the magnitude of underreporting of racist hate crimes and incidents of hate speech in the State party and by the lack of a comprehensive mechanism to collect data on such incidents. The Committee is also concerned by the gap between the number of hate crimes registered by the police, the number of prosecutions, and the number of convictions where article 81 (6) of the Criminal Code was explicitly applied by courts. The Committee is also concerned by the lack of an explicit prohibition in the Criminal Code of organizations that promote racial discrimination, and of participation in such organizations."

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
