The assault resulted in the victim sustaining a serious injury to his eye resulting in loss of sight in that eye. The case was an appeal against the severity of a sentence of three and a half years imprisonment with the final eighteen months suspended for assault causing harm. During the altercation, the term 'Paki' was allegedly used by members of the assaulting group though not necessarily the appellant.	The court reduced the original sentence of 3.5 years with the final 18 months suspended to 3.5 years with the final two years suspended.	The Court noted that mitigation in this case was so extensive that the sentencing judge remarked that the appellant had "perfect mitigation".	There are no key concepts clarified by this case. From the report it cannot be determined if the racist element within the case was considered by the Court when sentencing. The Court of Appeal said very little regarding the racist element, except to observe that the appellant was not the initiator of the racial abuse.	"Although the court accepts that the appellant did not intend the outcome and was not the initiator of the racial abuse that formed a backdrop to this attack, this was a case that required to be marked by an immediate prison sentence."

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
