The key findings may be summarised as the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - the study mentions numerous illustrations of direct and indirect discrimination. "Black", African, "Arab", "Muslim" as referred by the population, face disproportionate levels of discrimination in accessing housing. - the widespread racism grounded in stereotypical beliefs have a direct impact on migrants and the experience of housing discrimination. - a racist discourse and practices are normalised which leads to a culture of impunity. - real estate agents play a central role in producing and sustaining housing discrimination in Malta. - there is a fear of renting/subletting to African nationals or Arabs by property owners since the presence of certain ethnics minorities in neighborhoods is perceived as lowering property prices. - migrants are usually not aware of their rights or ways to seek remedies. They mainly lack of trust in the authorities. | Recent international and national literature as well as official international and national surveys related to the topic were reviewed. Personal interviews with keys stakeholders, property owners, developers or real estate agents and migrants living in Malta were held. Situation testing exercises were conducted with migrants targeting property owners via telephone or email. | Personal interviews were conducted with 5 key stakeholders, 30 property owners or real estate agents and with 50 migrants living in Malta. 30 testing exercises were conducted. | Not applicable - national level |
