However, discrepancies between ethnic groups are quite pronounced. Sub-Saharan, Gypsy populations and afro Latin stand out above the average. Out of the 350 people who have experienced or witnessed a discriminatory situation, perceived that the reasons for such discrimination were, in the following order, the place of origin, colour of skin or physical features and as well as practices, customs or cultural behaviour. Most common areas where discrimination occurs are the workplace, police treatment and establishments and public spaces.	The objectives, the methodology and the study questionnaire, have taken as a basis the previous studies carried out in 2010 and 2011, in order to allow the comparison of data from each of them. From methodological estimations in these studies, the study object of this contract is proposed advance, deepen, and implement improvements that contribute to enrich quantitatively and qualitatively the same results, allowing a larger sample and, based on this, of a redesign of the sampling distribution.
