In public, Islam is often considered as a religion without nuances. Muslims are in general perceived to be a homogeneous group of people. Examples of prejudices about Islam and Muslims in Sweden concern the oppression of women, violence, anti-democracy and unproductivity. The overview shows that Islamophobia in Sweden is expressed through threats, violence, diminishing looks, hate crimes, insults, lesser opportunities on the labour market and harassment at school and in the workplace. It was not uncommon for women who wear headscarves to receive threats or insults when they are in public places.
