Consequently, the investigation of bias motivation both at the stage of preliminary investigation ordered by the Public Prosecutor and at the stage of ex proprio initial investigation by the police becomes even more necessary. The GNCHR reports that it took a very long time for the three powers - legislative, executive and judicial - to acknowledge that there is organised criminal racist violence in Greece. The GNCHR highlights that the State should take up initiatives and prove that society cannot tolerate violence and racism.
