One of the main issues was the so called hate postings on the internet. Especially on subjects of migrants and asylum seekers. This issue has led to a radicalisation and agitation of right-wing extremists against anything related to Islam. Therefore politically motivated crimes (PMK) have increased in 2016. Fear is the main tool of right-wing propaganda to incite hatred and disdain towards all Muslim people in Germany. According to the report radical Islamic terrorism was a prominent threat to national security in Germany. With 5 separate attacks, of which one with 12 casualties, 2016 had the most attacks in recent years.	Qualitative analysis of major anti-constitutional crimes committed in Germany.
