The net discrimination rate calculated based on a comparison between Finnish job applicants and four migrant groups, show that the rate is highest for persons with Iraqi (62 %) and Somali (72 %) background. The rate for the other groups were 28 % (English) and 38 % (Russian).	Correspondence field experiment	Five fictitious job applications were submitted for 1000 vacancies. The main difference between the five applications were the names and mother tongue of the applicants. The mother tongues were Finnish, English, Iraqi, Russian and Somali.
