The Committee stated that it is also concerned at reports of widespread impunity for such crimes. The Committee concluded that Greece should:</p> <p>(a) Systematically investigate all forms of hate crime, including violent acts, prosecute perpetrators and, if they are found guilty, convict and punish them;</p> <p>(b) Provide training on hate crime to law enforcement officials and the judiciary in order to improve their initial handling of hate crime reports and the subsequent investigation and prosecution of such crime.</p>	The working methods for the preparation of the CAT reports involve documentary analyses, a visit to the country concerned, confidential dialogue with the national authorities and requesting reports from NGOs and human rights related national bodies.	The reports of the UNCAT are analyses based on a great deal of information gathered from the country itself and the reports of NGOs and human rights related national bodies.
