Racism & xenophobia, Discrimination	France, French Consultative Commission for Human Rights	36% of the population view Muslims as 'forming a separate group in society'. Certain Muslim religious practices are still perceived as difficult to reconcile with French society, even if levels remain stable overall compared to last year, from an analytical framework a repressive analysis of refugees. Anti-Muslim acts recorded 12 showed an overall increase of 54% over the past year - 154 acts (compared to 100 in 2018) which are made up of 91 threats (compared to 55 in 2018) and 63 acts (compared to 45 in 2018), an increase of 40%.	The CNCDH bases its analyses on the statistical assessment of the Ministry of the Interior and the Ministry of Justice, surveys on public opinion, analyses by CNCDH partner researchers, and in particular their longitudinal tolerance index, and contributions from institutional, association and international actors.
