Hate crime	Austria, Federal Ministry for the Interior (Bundesministerium für Inneres)	The identification and recognition of bias motives has become an integral part of the work routine of the Austrian police since November 2020. The first half year of police recognition (November 2020 to April 2021) was statistically evaluated. The key results are: In 1,936 bias-motivated crimes, 2,401 bias motives were registered. The categories "national/ethnic origin", "ideology/ political views" and "religion" were the ones most frequently assigned to the offences. In terms of bias motivations, "gender", "sexual orientation", Muslim faith and "disability" dominated in offences against life and limb, freedom, honour or sexual integrity and self-determination.
