Hate crime	Estonia, Ministry of Justice (Justitsministeerium)	The study discusses the results of victim surveys conducted between 2010-2021. Concerning hate crime, it outlines that in 2021, 0.8% of respondents fell victim to a physical attack and 7% of respondents fell victim to a verbal or written attack due to their nationality, race, skin colour, religion, disability or sexual orientation. The percentages were same in 2020. It was not clarified which specific protected ground was the motive of the attacks in these cases.	Qualitative research - the study analyses the surveys conducted by phone, in person or online between 2010-2021.	Between 2010-2020, the number of respondents was between 1000-1102, in 2021, the number of respondents was 2000.
