People who were seriously injured or killed were not reported. The offenses were recorded in the federal states of Berlin, Baden-Württemberg and Bavaria. Furthermore, 1 demonstration against "Germany's Islamisation" that was allegedly influenced by right-wing extremists was counted by the domestic intelligence authorities.	Figures were drawn from the police crime statistics (Polizeiliche Kriminalstatistik) on "politically motivated crime" (politisch motivierte Kriminalität) which includes the category "hostile to Islam" (islamfeindlich).
