The hate crimes against people with disabilities, Jews and people who have visible racial or background signs were recognized the best by police officers and prosecutors. The study points out that the research participants are better acquainted how to recognize hate speech and hate crime in comparison with general society, however at the same time 9.6 % of research participants "agree" or "absolutely agree" that negative comments online about some societal groups do not harm anyone.
