South Asians reported 17 percent of all crimes to iReport.ie and 32 percent of all discrimination.	An online questionnaire collects data on personal characteristics, the date, location, type and consequence of each incident, and details about reporting and outcomes. The data is independently analysed and results published annually.	600 reports were received in 2022 by voluntary and anonymous reporting by the public to the iReport.ie racist incident reporting platform hosted by INAR. This included 223 reports about criminal offences (excluding incitement to hatred). There were 190 reports about discrimination, and 42 reports of other recordable racist incidents.
