South Asians reported 23 percent of all crimes to iReport.ie and 21 percent of all discrimination.	An online questionnaire collects data on personal characteristics, the date, location, type and consequence of each incident, and details about reporting and outcomes. The data is independently analysed and results published annually.	274 reports were received in 2023 by voluntary and anonymous reporting by the public to the iReport.ie racist incident reporting platform hosted by INAR. This included 99 reports about criminal offences (excluding incitement to hatred). There were 81 reports about discrimination, and 16 reports of other recordable racist incidents.
