The Act prohibits the wearing of clothing that completely or partially conceals the face in the areas of educational, governmental, and nursing care institutions. This study found that for Muslim women who wear clothing that completely or partially cover the face, the Act had a strong negative impact on their well-being and their ability to participate in society. They have more often been treated negatively by bystanders or professionals since the Act took effect. They feel more isolated and avoid places where the ban applies. They are physically harassed and the Act has contributed to a sense of insecurity among these women.
