In terms of specific groups, respondents identify Roma (61%), women (50%), older adults (44%), and migrants (43%) as the most frequently discriminated against. Migrants are the group facing the highest level of social distance. 43% of respondents would not accept migrants as close relatives, while 24% hold the same view in relation to Bosniaks/Muslims. Furthermore, 34% of respondents do not want migrants to live permanently in their country or neighbourhood, compared to 9% of Bosniaks/Muslims.	Quantitative (questionnaire face to face)	The research was conducted on a random, representative sample of 1,500 citizens aged 18 and over. The data was collected using the "face-to-face" method. The structure of the sample is as follows: Gender: 52% women, 48% men. Age: 17% aged 18-24 40% aged 25-39 24% aged 40-54 18% aged 55+ Education: 16% with incomplete or completed primary education 56% with secondary education 28% with higher education or university degree.
