Despite the progress made, certain issues remain of concern. The legal status of the CET remains unclear, while its mandate and powers need to be strengthened. Although nationality has been added as a protected characteristic in the Equal Treatment Act, the mandate of the CET has not been extended accordingly. According to recent studies, there are racist incidents in schools. Hate speech has risen sharply in Luxembourg and its digitalisation has increased considerably in recent years. As a result, relevant statistical data remains scattered and under-reporting remains a problem. In practice, victims of hate speech do not receive support from the authorities, and the efforts of media regulatory and self-regulatory bodies to combat hate speech are fragmented. The CET has been attached to the Chamber of Deputies, which has further consolidated its independence. In 2021, racism against Muslims was felt most in the workplace (68%), on social networks (36%), in education/training (32%), in the media (24%) and on the streets (24%).	ECRI, an independent human rights monitoring body of the Council of Europe, monitors racism, discrimination, and intolerance in member states through five-year cycles. Its reports are based on documentary analyses, on-site visits and dialogue with national authorities. The sixth round focuses on effective equality, hate speech and violence, and integration, while addressing country-specific issues.
