The report shows that ethnic minorities are more often charged for crimes in cases where they are later acquitted from. In 2009-2019, the probability of getting charged with af crime without conviction was 11 pct. for people with Danish origin while it was 14 and 16 pct. for immigrants and descendants respectively. These difference corresponds to a 27 pct. increase in the probability of getting charged with a crime that leads to acquittal for immigrants compared to citizens with Danish origin and a 45 pct. higher increase for descendants of immigrants compared to citizens with Danish origin.
