Questions and Answers

Question 1:

How many research agencies are invited to this tender?

Answer 1:

This is an open call for tenders. It is addressed to all interested economic operators eligible to participate in accordance with section 9 of Annex A –Tender Specifications.

Question 2:

In the Phase 1 of the project, usage of Online Panels, as a starting point of RDS methodology, is it permitted to start with?

Answer 2:

Please refer to Section 4 (Activity 6) of Annex A.1 Technical Specifications for a detailed description of the tasks covered under Stage 1 of the project. Online panels are not foreseen.

Question 3:

Will the awareness – raising campaign activity be a duty of the market research agency or not? Basically, our key concern is whether budget required in awareness raising campaign is part of the research budget.

Answer 3:

Yes, the awareness-raising campaign is included under the scope of this tender.

Question 4:

Is it legal to collect sensitive data in France & Hungary? According to my info up to now, in France & Hungary it is rather not permitted to process such data, even if there is consent from the respondent.

Answer 4:

The work must be carried out in accordance with national laws, and European and international norms. At the same time, previous research by the FRA - notably the European Union Minorities



and Discrimination Survey (EU-MIDIS) - as well as on-going research successfully collect anonymised data on various issues, including ethnicity and religion of the respondents, in all 27 European Union Member States (that is, including France and Hungary).
