1 Measures implemented to foster social rights and equal treatment in the recovery from the pandemic

<p>Name of the measure in English</p>	<p>Decree on the establishment of a temporary registry and the method of payment of one-time financial assistance to all adult citizens of the Republic of Serbia to reduce the negative effects caused by the SARS-CoV-2 pandemic COVID-19</p>
<p>Name of the measure in the national language(s)</p>	<p>Uredba o formiranju privremenog registra i načinu uplate jednokratne novčane pomoći svim punoletnim državljanima Republike Srbije u cilju smanjivanja negativnih efekata prouzrokovanih pandemijom bolesti COVID-19 izazvane virusom SARS-CoV-2</p>

<p>Population group(s) covered by the measure</p> <p><i>Delete as appropriate</i></p>	<p>Unspecified: adult citizens of the Republic of Serbia with valid ID cards. Under the provisions of the Decree, specific measures were introduced for pension recipients and beneficiaries of the financial social assistance. Individuals coming from these two population groups were not obliged to apply for this one-time financial assistance.</p>

<p><i>Multiple answers possible, but preference should be given to measures that apply to discrete population groups</i></p>	
<p>Summary description of how the measure applies to the population group(s)</p>	<p>The measure targeted all adult citizens of the Republic of Serbia, and in that regard, did not have specific treatment of particularly vulnerable population groups. The status of employment or income did not condition the right to one-time financial assistance, and the only applicable criteria was the possession of the valid ID card of the Republic of Serbia. After the application procedure, which was not prescribed for pensioners and beneficiaries of financial social assistance, who were automatically enlisted for the payment, the Treasury Administration delivered the payment of 100 EUR in dinar counter value.¹</p> <p>When applying, the citizen had to deliver their name, surname, citizens unique personal number (<i>'jedinostveni matični broj građana'</i>), the registration number of their valid ID card, name of the bank with which the account of that citizen is opened or will be opened and the telephone number and/or e-mail address. In cases when citizens were not clients of the bank, the bank was responsible for opening the special purpose account for the payment.</p>
<p>Summary description of how the measure will impact (positively or negatively) social rights and equal treatment in the recovery</p>	<p>Decree on the establishment of a temporary registry and the payment method of one-time financial assistance to all adult citizens of the Republic of Serbia positively impacted some population groups since it increased their income for the time of the implementation of the measure. However, the Decree failed to address already existing inequalities. For example, the Decree failed to recognize families with children as a specific group needing more than one-time financial assistance. Also, the possession of the valid ID card as criteria for the payment excluded the Roma population without personal documents (so-called legally</p>

	invisible persons), ² homeless people, ³ and other vulnerable groups which were not aware of the measure. Keeping in mind the total budget for implementing the measure and the fact that the assistance was not selective, there is a concern that the State failed to implement its obligation to use maximum available resources for the progressive realization of social rights.
Summary description of the extent to which the measure foresees the provision of enabling social services	This measure does not foresee the provision of enabling social services.
Entity or organisation responsible to implement the measure	Ministry of Finance, Treasury Administration
Duration of the measure	24 April 2020 – ongoing
Budget allocated to implement the measure	The total budget is not transparent. However, the Fiscal Council (<i>Fiskalni savet</i>) reported that the budget allocated for implementing the abovementioned measure was 610 million EUR. ⁴
Summary description of how any foreseen impact assessment of the measure will be carried out	The impact assessment of the measure was not prescribed. Other than the Fiscal Council (<i>Fiskalni savet</i>), which assessed the implementation of the Decree from an economic and fiscal perspective, ⁵ other impact assessment exercises were not conducted.

<p>Organisation(s) involved in the monitoring tool or mechanism</p> <p><i>Delete as appropriate</i></p> <p><i>Multiple answers possible</i></p>	<p>Different organizations and institutions monitor specific aspects of the Government’s policies to foster social rights and equal treatment in the recovery from the pandemic. For example, civil society organizations monitor the implementation of the adopted measures from the perspective of specific population groups.⁶ Also, the Commissioner for the Protection of Equality (<i>Poverenik za zaštitu ravnopravnosti</i>) prepared the report on the discrimination of elderly.⁷ At the same time, the Protector of Citizens (<i>Zaštitnik građana</i>) published the report on the effects of the pandemic on Roma population.⁸ However, none of these reports or institutions prepared or conducted the overall monitoring exercise to assess the effectiveness of national schemes to foster social rights and equal treatment in the recovery from the pandemic.</p>
