



INFORMATION NOTICE

The Agency would like to inform the participants of the Fundamental Rights Forum (FRF) who provide their personal data while using the *Slido web application which offers real time polls and questions functionality*. Personal data is not requested but in case it is submitted, personal data will be deleted after 1 month of the FRF event.

Purpose: The purpose of the processing of the personal data is to facilitate interactive debates among FRF participants and to follow up with debates taking place during the FRF.

Description of Data: The personal data provided by the data subject while using *Slido web app* during the FRF, which indirectly or directly identifies the data subject.

Note: All polls and questions submitted to Slido application are anonymous by default.

The Agency does not require from the participants (data subjects) to submit any personal data.

In case participants provide their personal data when submitting a question, please be aware that the contents might be presented live on screen for public viewing during the event. It is strongly recommended that you do not provide any personal data when submitting your questions. However, in case you do so then please be informed of the provision in this information apply.

Data Controller: The Data Controller is the FRA. This data is available on request by the Data Controller and only for the purposes listed above.

Legal Basis: The Legal basis of the processing operation for which the data are intended is Article 5 of Regulation (EC) No 45/2001.

Access to the Data: Data can be accessed by the project manager and delegated project members.

Data Subjects are informed of the following rights in line with Articles 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18 of Regulation (EC) No 45/2001:

Right of access – Data subjects have the right to access his or her personal data at any time within 25 working days, and free of charge, by sending an email request to the frf@fra.europa.eu. The Agency will address the request within 15 working days from the receipt of the request.

Right to rectify – Data subjects have the right to rectify their data without delay of inaccurate or incomplete personal data at any time within 25 working days. The Agency will address the request within 15 working days from the receipt of the request.

Right to block – Data subjects have the right to block their data at any time within 25 working days by sending an email to the frf@fra.europa.eu, where their accuracy is contested by the data subject; or the controller no longer needs them for the accomplishment of its tasks but they have to be maintained for purposes of proof; or the processing is unlawful and the data subject opposes their erasure and demands their blocking instead. The Agency will address the request within 15 working days from the receipt of the request.

Right to erasure – Data subjects have the right to request to the controller at any time within 25 working days of the erasure of their data, if their processing is unlawful, particularly where the provisions of Sections 1, 2 and 3 of Chapter II have been infringed, by sending an e-mail to frf@fra.europa.eu. The Agency will address the request within 15 working days from the receipt of the request.

Right to obtain notification to third parties – Data subjects have the right obtain from the controller the notification to third parties to whom the data have been disclosed of any rectification, erasure or blocking pursuant to Article 13 to 16, at any time unless this proves impossible or involve a disproportionate effort. The Agency will address the request within 15 working days from the receipt of the request.

Right to object – Data subjects have the right:

- To object at any time within 25 working days by sending an email request to the frf@fra.europa.eu, on compelling legitimate grounds relating to his or her particular situation, to the processing of data relating to him or her, except in the cases covered by Article 5(b), (c) and (d). Where there is a justified objection, the processing in question may no longer involve those data. The Agency will address the request within 15 working days from the receipt of the request.
- To be informed before personal data are disclosed for the first time to third parties or before they are used on their behalf for the purposes of direct marketing, and to be expressly offered the right to object free of charge to such disclosure or use. The Agency will address the request within 15 working days from the receipt of the request.

Right to have recourse – Pursuant Article 11 of Regulation 45/2001, data subjects have the right to have recourse at any time to the European Data Protection Supervisor: <http://www.edps.europa.eu>.

If the data subjects have any queries concerning the processing of their personal data, they may address them to the FRA, the Data Controller by contacting the frf@fra.europa.eu.

Date when processing starts: 20/06/2016 [start of the FRF]

Place of storage: the data will be stored in the *Slido web* application server. The servers are located inside EU territory (Ireland) and any personal data submitted is deleted by the Agency after the event closure on 23/06/2016.

Retention policy: Personal data is stored for a period of 1 month after the FRF event.
