

## Roma Survey - Country Data - Greece

### Survey & EU targets

- **Respondents:** in Greece, 522 Roma took part in the survey, representing 1447 household members.
- **EU-level objectives:** Greece is likely to meet the 2030 targets only in one EU-level objective: housing.

### Discrimination & antigypsyism

- **Discrimination:** 42% of Roma in Greece say they were discriminated against in the year before the survey compared to 48% in 2016 (EU-total: 31%).
- **Harassment:** 39% of Roma in Greece experienced hate-motivated harassment in the year before the survey, compared to 50% in 2016 (EU-total: 19%).

### Participation, reporting & trust

- **Reporting:** No (0%) Roma in Greece reported discrimination to an official body, compared to 8% in 2016 (EU-total: 6%).
- **Trust in police:** 42% of Roma in Greece tend to trust the police, compared to 54% in 2016 (EU-total: 49%). This compares to 60% of the general Greek population.

### Poverty

- **Poverty:** 88% of Roma in Greece are at risk of poverty, compared to 96% in 2016 (the EU-total: 70%). This compares to 19% of the general Greek population.
- **Child poverty:** 88% of Roma children in Greece are at risk of poverty, compared to 98% in 2016 (EU-total: 77%). This compares to 22% of children in Greece in general.
- **Severe material deprivation:** 52% of Roma in Greece live in severe materials deprivation, compared to 73% in 2016 (EU-total: 37%). This compares to 17% of the Greek population in general.

### Education

- **Early childhood education:** 22% of Roma children in Greece attend early childhood education, compared to 21% in 2016 (EU-total: 53%). This compares to 69% of Greek children in general.
- **Educational attainment:** 2% of young Roma in Greece have completed at least upper-secondary education, compared to 8% in 2016 (EU-total: 32%). This compares to 96% of the general Greece population.
- **Segregation:** 57% of Roma children in Greece attend a school where all or most pupils are Roma, compared to 46% in 2016 (EU-total: 46%).

### Work

- **Employment:** 54% of Roma in Greece are in paid work, compared to 52% in 2016 (EU-total: 54%). This compares to 67% of Greek people generally.

- **NEET rates:** 55% of young Roma in Greece are neither in employment, education or training, compared to 59% in 2016 (EU-total: 47%). This compares to 12% of young people in Greece generally.
- **Work discrimination:** 61% of Roma in Greece felt discriminated against when looking for work compared to 24% in 2016 (EU-total: 36%). 27% felt discriminated at work, compared to 10% in 2016 (EU-total: 22%).

## Housing

- **Housing deprivation:** in Greece, 34% of Roma live in housing deprivation, compared to 50% in 2016 (EU-total: 47%). This compares to 18% of the general Greek population.
- **Overcrowding:** 93% of Roma in Greece live in an overcrowded housing, compared to 92% in 2016 (EU-total: 83%). This compares to 27% of the overall Greek population.
- **Housing discrimination:** 28% of Roma in Greece felt discriminated against when looking for housing, compared to 44% in 2016 (EU-total: 35%).

## Health

- **Health discrimination:** 15% of Roma in Greece felt discriminated against when accessing healthcare, compared to 20% in 2016 (EU-total: 16%).
