

Recommendations:

- Adopt a definition of coherence in human rights policies to be consistently used by EU institutions when developing policy
- 2. Align rhetoric and practice
- 3. Ensure vertical and horizontal coherence in the use of the EU's policy toolbox
- 4. Anchor EU human rights activities in the Charter







Improve knowledge

Recommendations:

- 1. Train officials on human rights
- 2. Rely on national human rights institutions
- 3. Strengthen the EU's engagement with non-state actors
- 4. Adopt OHCHR measurement model for human rights indicators
- 5. Improve and raise awareness of impact assessments
- 6. Build a human rights information system

- 1. Revise the mandate of FRA
- 2. Implement the EU's commitment to human rights through international law

- 6. Enforce conditionality and compliance with the EU Charter linked to ESI and CAP funds







Strengthen HR in EU external affairs

Recommendations:

- Increase support and resources for HR officials in the EEAS / EU Delegations
- 2. Align positions in multilateral fora through transparent strategic planning
- 3. Explore smart enforcement of conditionality
- 4. Implement the rights-based approach to development
- Firmly ground CSDP in international human rights standards
- 6. Enhance the protection of vulnerable groups in EU crisis management
